



MR. KOSIT FUANGSWASDI VICE PRESIDENT, EXPLORATION AND PRODUCTION

Mr. Kosit is a geology graduate from Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok. He obtained an Executive MBA from Sasin Graduate Institute of Business Administration and a number of diplomas and certificates in exploration technologies, geology and geophysics, engineering, economics and knowledge management in energy exploration and production.

Mr. Kosit began his career with Shell and Esso in onshore exploration seismic and wildcat drilling in Central and Northeastern Thailand leading to a discovery of the presently known Sirikit Field and Nam Phong Gas Field. He became in charge of exploration in Thailand for Phillips Petroleum until mid 1984 including Oklahoma City oil field development geology, exploration geology of Indonesian Sulawesi and subsurface exploration geology of the North Sea's Ekofisk.

Mr. Kosit came to Union Oil, later known as Unocal in 1984 as a development geologist. His main task was to alleviate the rapidly declined Erawan, first gas field of the Kingdom. He was put in charge in nearly all facets of exploration geology and geophysics, and engineering. He was instrumental to the negotiation to farm-in and later, bought out interest and operatorship of Block B12/27, put the block under aggressive exploration programs, develop sales contract, name all the fields including Pailin and put resources onstream. His achievements were discoveries and developments of nearly 20 natural oil and gas fields in the Gulf of Thailand, subcommercial and stranded discoveries in many parts of N. Asean region. Gas production increased from 65 MMCFD to more than 2 BCFD, plus oil and condensate from zero to more than 100,000 BOPD. Mr. Kosit was named managers and directors with various capacities in exploration, operations, public and government affairs, crisis communication, human resources, health-environment-safety, social engineering, and president's office.

After the merger with Chevron in 2005, Mr. Kosit became in charge of coordinating all activities among exploration, operations and external activities with the government, business partners and the public. He was moved to Beijing, China in 2007 as a lead negotiator with PetroChina for the exploration and development of the gas fields in Sichuan. His focuses were not only exploration and development, but also safety and social engineering. Chevron became the first foreign operator of a large onshore project in the People's Republic of China.

Mr. Kosit is an AAPG Certified Petroleum Geologist and has been active since 1982, including activities with the Circum Pacific Council. He is a regular visiting lecturer in many local universities in energy E&P, advanced technologies, strategic management, operations and project management, and knowledge management.

Mr. Kosit was born on 30 May 1959. He is married with two children. His favorite pastimes include sporting of nearly all kinds especially golf, traveling, reading, teaching, and charity activities.
